Article 128 of the Namibian Constitution - The Central Bank

There shall be established by Act of Parliament a Central Bank of the Republic of Namibia, which shall serve as the State's principal instrument <u>to control the</u> <u>money supply, the currency</u> and the institutions of finance, and to perform all other functions ordinarily performed by a central bank.

Section 38 (1) of the Bank of Namibia Act 1 of 2020

<u>Authority to issue banknotes and coins.</u> The Bank is the sole issuer of banknotes and coins in Namibia and only such banknotes and coins issued by the Bank are legal tender in Namibia, subject to section 45.

Demand and Supply of Currency:





What informs the general demand of currency?

- Economic activities, interest rates, inflation, capital flow, and money supply.
- Withdrawal of unfit currency from circulation: N\$2.3 billion in 2022



Increased demand appreciates the currency value, while increased supply decreases the currency value, hence he replenishment of physical currency is mainly informed by demand.

Notes with the **highest velocity: N\$10 and N\$200**, whereas the highest volume change with regards to banknotes in circulation was observed with the **N\$10 banknote at 15.7%.**

JG – N\$20 & N\$200 Modified Banknotes Project (2022 – 2023)

- 1. Normal Currency Replenishment Cycle. (*last replenishments in 2018*).
- 2. Change of a level 1 security feature, which is the **Governor's** signature.
- 3. BoN Act, section 40.1 (Currency features) Publish the security features in the Government Gazette prior to the issuing of the banknotes.

Offences relating to currency: Section 80 of BoN Act 1 of 2020:

Illegal reproduction of currency – counterfeiting of national currency is illegal. If convicted, will be liable to a fine not exceeding N\$100 000 or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding five years or to both such fine and such imprisonment, and in the case of a second or subsequent conviction, to a fine not exceeding N\$500 000 or imprisonment for a period not more than 25 years or to both such fine and such imprisonment.

2. Defacing of national currency, taking images without BoN approval is an offence.

A person commits an offence, if the person - (a) <u>willfully defaces</u>, soils or damages a banknote or coin of the Bank or without a reasonable excuse, possesses any defaced, soiled or damaged banknote or coin of the Bank or without the authority of the Bank, writes or places any drawing on a banknote of the Bank that is legal tender or attaches to it anything in an advertisement.

Liable to a fine not exceeding N\$50 000 or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding three years or to both such fine and such imprisonment.
